- **Mother Teresa:** The Catholic nun and missionary who founded the Missionaries of Charity to serve the poor and sick in Calcutta, India.




Influential Artists

- **Vincent van Gogh:** The Dutch post-impressionist painter whose bold use of color and expressive brushwork revolutionized modern art.




- **Salvador Dalí:** The Spanish surrealist painter and filmmaker who is known for his bizarre and dreamlike imagery.
