
A Week-by-Week Reckoning of Trump's First Year in Office



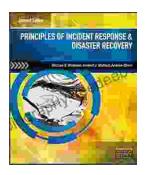
