- Slip one, knit one, pass slipped stitch over (sl1, k1, psso): To slip one, knit one, pass slipped stitch over, slip the first stitch on the left-hand needle to the right-hand needle without knitting it. Knit the next

stitch, then pass the slipped stitch over the knit stitch and off the righthand needle.

Patterns

There are many different patterns available for knitting lace leaves for baby. You can find patterns for simple leaves, complex leaves, and even leaves with embellishments. Here is a simple pattern for a lace leaf:

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
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
