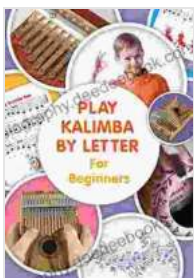


Play Kalimba by Letter for Beginners: A Comprehensive Guide

How to Hold a Kalimba

To hold a kalimba, place your left hand on the soundboard, and your right hand on the tines. Your left thumb should rest on the back of the kalimba, and your right thumb should pluck the tines.

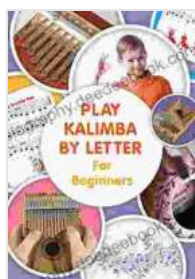
Tips for Playing Kalimba
