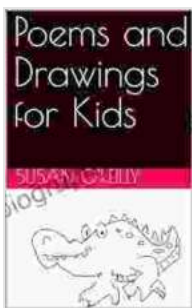

The Power of Drawings

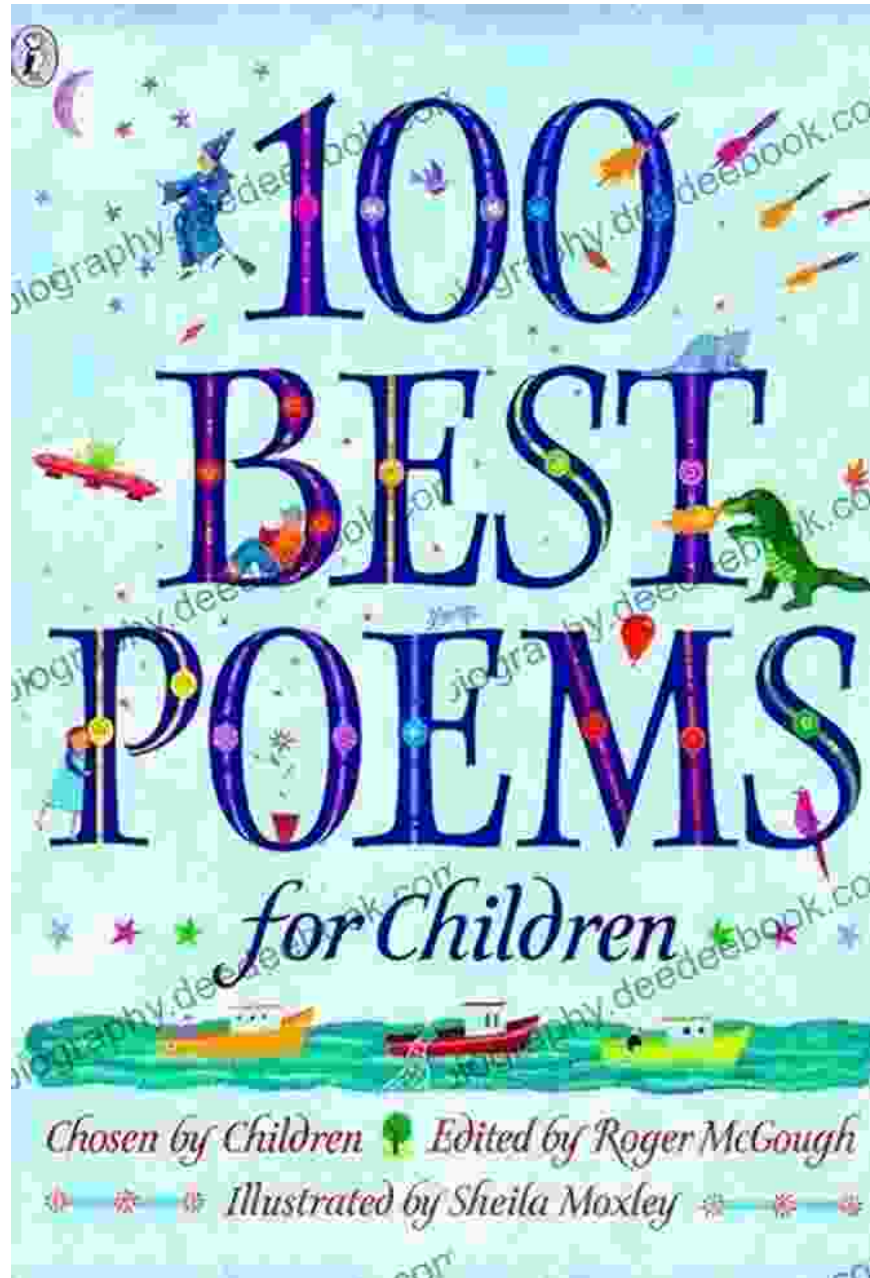
Drawings, on the other hand, unleash the visual imagination, encouraging children to express their thoughts, emotions, and experiences through lines, shapes, and colors.

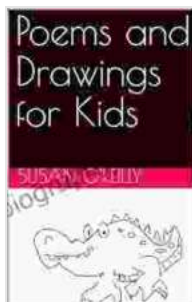
