5. Fasten off the yarn and weave in any loose ends.

Animal-Shaped Rugs

Materials:

- Worsted weight yarn in various colors
- Crochet hook size H/8 (5mm)

- Fiberfill stuffing (for 3D shapes)

1. Start by crocheting the base of the rug in the desired shape.

- Make the rug large enough for your child to play and crawl on comfortably.
- Consider adding non-slip backing to the rug for added safety.
