

Thomas Andrews: The Titanic's Shipbuilder, A Mastermind Behind the Legendary Vessel

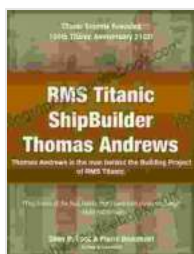


Thomas Andrews Jr. (February 7, 1873 – April 15, 1912) was a British shipbuilder and businessman who served as the managing director of the Harland and Wolff shipyard in Belfast, Ireland. He is best known for his role

Early Life and Education

Andrews attended Royal Belfast Academical Institution, where he excelled in mathematics and science. He then studied engineering at Queen's University Belfast. Upon graduating, he joined Harland and Wolff as an apprentice draughtsman in 1891.

Career at Harland and Wolff

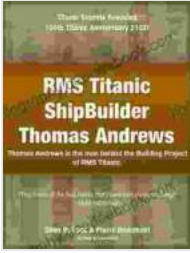

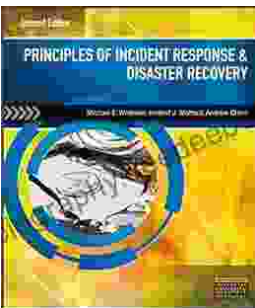
